Commencement Exercises Nome High S. Held

May 22, 1936

The largest class of the Nome High School to graduate for a number of years was the center of the ceremonies at the Commencement Exercises held last night at the Dream Theatre.

They were Pearse Walsh, Dorothy Nelson, Evelyn Wallace, Gertrude Johansen, Milton O'Farrell, and Walter Slack. They received the congratulations of a crowded auditorium.

The Commencement exercises consisted of Invocation by Rev. Norman McCay; Girls' Glee Club in two songs; Address by C. C. Tanner; Presentation of Awards by Supt. W. H. Bloom; Presentation of Diplomas by Mrs. A. T. McLain a member of the School Board, and Benediction by Father Cunningham.

The various features of the exercises were interesting thruout and with the presentation of awards the departing graduates received much applause, undoubtedly a time which they have been waiting for a long time.

COMMENCEMENT HELD THEATRE LAST NIGHT

The Commencement Exercises of the Nome High School took place last evening in the Dream Theatre at which three seniors were matriculated—Miss Virginia Harper, James Walsh and Ernest Boulanger.

The program commenced at 8 pm. with a Processional played by Milton O'Farrell on the piano.

Invocation was asked by the Rev. Norman McCay of the Federated church.

The Girls' Glee Club sang "Piper June" by Carew, directed by Miss Mildred Scott, and accompanied by Miss Aleda Brinkerhoff.

Presentation of awards for activity and scholarships during the school term was made by Superintendent W. H. Bloom to Miss Virginia Harper, first; James Walsh, second; and Miss Dorothy Nelson, third.

Violin Solos were rendered by Richard Lee accompanied by Miss Mildred Scott—Serenade by Franz Drdla, and Valsette by Felix Borowski.

The graduates address was given by J. D. Harlan who had an inspiring message to give the graduates on their graduation from high school, to the faculty, parents, and townspeople.

A vocal solo was rendered by Mrs. Luther Dunbar accompanied by Milton O'Farrell—Kentucky Babe.

L. E. Rynning, president of the Nome School Board, presented the diplomas to the graduates and the exercises were at an end.

The graduates received the congratulations of their many friends following the exercises.

In his opening remarks Superintendent Bloom on behalf of the faculty and the school, had encouraging things to say for the spirit of cooperation given the school during the past winter, a period which followed closely on the disaster which came to Nome last September.

The majority of the present school faculty will remain on the staff again next year, it was made known. This morning, grade school students went back to school to receive their report cards and awards and place everything in order following their long winter's school term. School was officially closed today, not to open again until next fall, and the school children are again enjoying
